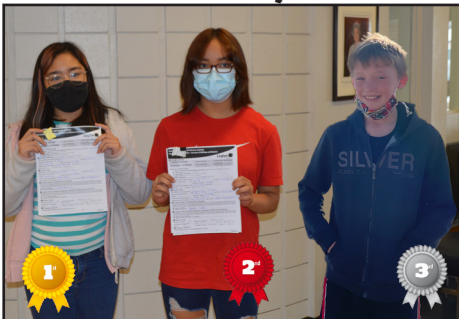

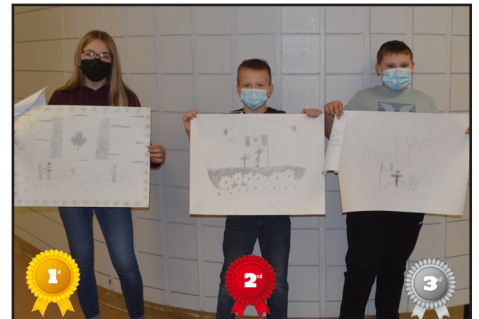

Remembering A Hometown Vet

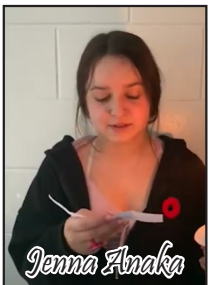
